



## Roadway Solicitation Guidelines

When applying for a Special Event Permit to conduct solicitation activities in the Road Right of Way, these issues will be considered, in addition to the other factors listed in the Code of Ordinances, Section 13-34, and Special Event Permitting Factors, Guidelines and Requirements, as deemed applicable.

The act of soliciting donations in the Road Right of Way is inherently dangerous, as roads and highways are not designed for this type of activity. The following guidelines are established with safety as the primary concern.

1. Time Issues. Applications will be reviewed for time of the year, days of the week and times of the day.
  - a. No permits will be issued during the Summer Tourist Season, defined as starting the Friday before Memorial Day and ending on Labor Day.
  - b. No permits during the Easter Weekend.
  - c. No permits during previously scheduled events (MB Marathon, etc.)
  - d. No permits before 9:00 am or after 6:00 pm
  - e. No solicitation will be allowed during inclement weather (will be listed in the "Conditions" of the Special Events Permit).
  
2. Location Issues. Applications will be reviewed for specific locations, and roads and intersections that present significant safety concerns will not be approved. The following locations in the unincorporated county will not be approved (not exclusive):
  - a. US Highway 501 (Business and ByPass)
  - b. US Highway 17 (Business and ByPass)
  - c. SC Highway 22
  - d. SC Highway 31
  - e. US Highway 9 (Business and ByPass)
  - f. US Highway 544
  - g. US Highway 90
  - h. US Highway 905
  - i. US Highway 701
  - j. SC Highway 707
  - k. Carolina Forest Boulevard
  - l. Intersections near Schools
  
3. Individual Action Issues. Applicants must agree to address the following issues regarding their activities:
  - a. Each participant must wear high visibility garments meeting the ANSI 107-2004 Class 2 or 3 Standard.
  - b. Each participant must visible display the organization they are representing.
