MEMBERS ABSENT:

In accordance with the FOIA, notices of the meeting were provided to the press stating the time, date, and place of the meeting.

CALL TO ORDER: Mr. Allen called the meeting to order at approximately 9:00 a.m.

INVOCATION: Mr. Allen gave the invocation.

Mr. Allen announced that Bill Howard would again be Vice-Chairman of the Committee and the only change would be that Danny Hardee would serve in place of Cam Crawford.

PUBLIC INPUT:

April O’Leary: Ms. O’Leary stated that she wanted to discuss the risk and financial burden of flooding noting that it affected the taxpayers and the local municipalities. The private sector carried little risk and economic impact to the flooding. It seemed that after the flood events, there was a large transfer of wealth from the taxpayers and municipalities to the for-profit private business sector in the housing and rebuilding industry. If they did not strengthen the laws to protect wetlands, they would continue to see more Horry County citizens affected by flood events resulting in significant decreases in property values. She had passed out a proposal to be considered that would regulate future land uses and explained how it could work to minimize flooding issues. She quoted statistics that listed Horry County compared to all other counties in South Carolina as having the highest percentage of impervious surfaces and land disturbances. Horry County also had the highest number of repetitive flooded families in the state at 34%. She thought the proposal was a good first step in helping to minimizing the impact from flooding.

Amelia Wood: Ms. Wood thanked the committee and specifically Mr. Hardee for addressing her issue of concern. It started the previous year when there were numerous rezoning requests in the Hwy 90 corridor. She said she thought it was safe to say that all the land that was not developed was zoned CFA. Mr. Hardee and Mr. Allen had spoken with her and she thanked them for their time. She noted that between Conway and SC 22, there were three major swamp systems that included thousands of acres of wetlands. Bridges at all the swamp system areas flooded during Hurricane Florence causing some places to be isolated for days. She referred to Ms. O’Leary’s proposal and added that she thought it would be a step in the right direction as well if it could be passed with revisions to the language on the CFA zoning ordinance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA CONTENTS: Before approving the agenda contents, Mr. Howard asked if they could add an executive session. Mr. Allen asked Mr. Carotti to explain. Mr. Carotti stated it would be for the receipt of legal advice relating to a potential client or other matters covered by the attorney-client privilege specifically Mr. Haldi's (inaudible) Mr. **Allen moved to approve the addition of an executive session. The motion was unanimously passed. Mr. Allen asked if there were any other additions or deletions to the agenda. Mr. Howard moved to approve the agenda contents as amended and the vote was unanimous.**

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Mr. Howard moved to approve the minutes for November 12, 2019 as submitted with a second from Mr. Hardee. The motion was unanimously passed.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Mr. David Gilreath explained to the committee that they had asked their Department Heads to put together some "Did you know" segments to help educate everyone on things they may or may not be aware of and would start with the basics.

Did you Know Ditches: Mr. Tom Roth commented that the presentations were not just for the committee but they had a Facebook / social media agenda as well to help inform the public of what was actually being done. He presented a slide with some statistics from the previous year on the ditch maintenance side / ditch cleaning either by hand, excavator or bush hogs and mowers totaling 234 miles of ditches.

Mr. Hardee asked how many total miles of ditches were there. Mr. Roth stated there were some that were maintained and some they had to clean. There was approximately 140-150 miles that they had easements for. They tried to clean with an excavator every two years but they were about four years behind but there were a lot they were unable to clean due to easements.

Mr. Allen asked how many excavators they had that were totally dedicated to Stormwater. Mr. Roth stated there were four medium to large excavators dedicated strictly to Stormwater and one mini. They had just purchased a Spider, which was a walking excavator but they did not have a sole operator for that yet so it was not being utilized every day. He clarified that on being four years behind, it was for ditches they had touched or cleaned before and did not take into account new ones coming in.

He presented a few slides showing the work they had done in different areas and using different methods with some showing before and after views.

Mr. Howard commented that they knew pretty much where the worst flooding would usually occur. He wanted to know if they concentrated on those specific areas. He also asked if there were any computer programs or maps to help them stay ahead of the flooding. Mr. Roth answered they had areas they called "hot spots" that they constantly shifted but would expedite a ditch when it caused flooding and they would prioritize by flooding in someone's home vs flooding in their back yard. They would also send someone out to check certain areas if they had weather warnings of possible flooding. Mr. Howard then referred back to the comment about having a new Spider but not having a full time operator and he wanted to know why they did not have one. Mr. Gilreath answered there was not a budgeted position for that. Mr. Roth commented that they had the opportunity to purchase the equipment even though they did not have a full time operator but that did not mean he did not have someone that could operate it, just not dedicated to that equipment full time. Mr. Gilreath explained that a Spider had been designed to go into places that a traditional excavator could not. Mr. Howard noted that they needed to create more

positions so they could stay ahead of flooding. Mr. Gilreath and Mr. Roth confirmed that was the case. Mr. Howard stated that was a priority and they needed to give some serious thought to staffing enough skilled labor to stay ahead.

Mr. Prince asked if that equipment could be used in the swamp. Mr. Roth stated it was not really designed for the swamps but had been purchased to go into subdivisions where there were fences and they did not have access to get in. They had always cleaned them by hand before but had never been able to dig them out. The machine could actually walk the ditches. Mr. Prince also brought up the issue of some swamp areas backing up and there was some discussion on the damage beavers were causing. Mr. Roth mentioned there were three men from the USDA that worked with them specifically on the beaver issue.

Mr. Allen stated that at every I & R meeting in the future, he wanted to see a map on the wall showing all of the county's watersheds with pins showing exactly where they were working. He also wanted to see a list of the department's goals for the year as well as their needs. He wanted to keep Stormwater at the forefront of Council because the issues in the County had to be addressed and avenues open for funding if needed. He said if they weren't addressed now, the County would be in a mess ten years in the future. He also asked that the subject be at the top of the agenda at every meeting because they absolutely had to get a handle on the flooding. He wanted to keep it in the forefront of everybody's mind. They would need money, men and machines and would do what they needed to do to accomplish that to keep up with the growth.

Did you Know Street Addressing: Mr. David Schwerd stated that his "did you know" presentation would be short but was vital to everyday public safety. Naming streets was one of the many jobs that Planning did that people didn't really think about. Every single street name in Horry County had to go through Horry County Planning Commission and be reviewed by staff. He explained the process for new street names and renaming current street names. It was a long process that required a public hearing and notification to adjacent property owners. The Planning Commission would coordinate with Public Works to make sure the sign was installed. It was initiated by the applicant or property owner and not by the Planning Department. Planning did review for duplication including between the different municipalities and it was becoming more and more difficult with all the growth over the last twenty years. Addresses were verified for all new building permits. In the last year, they had verified or assigned just over 7,000 addresses and were available in the GIS system by the next morning.

Mr. Allen commented that he had requested the next discussion item to be placed on the agenda because he had recently received calls from several people. There were people attempting to start a home based business and when applying for business licenses they had been told they needed different things. He wanted to ensure that there was an ordinance in place to encourage people who wanted to start a small home business.

Home Based Small Business Operations: Ms. Angie Jones noted that she also had received calls from several people trying to start up home businesses and they had to go through all types of loopholes. She commented there was a big difference from someone wanting to sell Mary Kay and someone who had fifteen dump trucks in a residential area. She introduced Alten Driggers from the Hospitality and Business License Department who would share some numbers with them.

Mr. Driggers stated that there were about 7,000 licensed home based businesses within Horry County and they sent out about 15,000 applications every year.

Mr. Schwerd added that they did their best in the Planning Department to make it as easy as possible for the people to get their business licenses in a home occupation. He commented that in 2005, the home occupation ordinance was completely rewritten and it was the most liberal, easiest to get a business license of any zoning in Horry County and possibly the whole state. He displayed a couple of slides showing the allowances and restrictions for obtaining a license and elaborated on some of the restrictions. He listed some specific types of businesses that would not be allowed and explained why. They would address any complaints and would first try to make them compliant rather than shutting them down. The ordinance listed things that could not be done rather than what could be done.

Mr. Allen mentioned a couple that he knew about that had maybe been misinformed on some things and wondered if there could be some type of hand out for people so they would be aware of all the restrictions. Mr. Schwerd stated that they did have those but the main problem seemed to be if someone wanted to do something in a subdivision that would not be an issue in a rural area but was restricted in a subdivision. They would always try to work with any issue, but it was now taking more time due to the number of applications and current home based businesses. They tried to process all applications in 5-7 business days but did have up to 15 business days to review it. Due to the sheer volume, the staff struggled to stay within that time frame. They also processed all the commercial zoning compliances and renewals for things that had special conditions on them like tow yards. They were trying to become more efficient but the sheer volume with only a couple of staff members reviewing them slowed them down.

Mr. Prince asked if they had any problems with HOA's. Mr. Schwerd answered that State Law required them to ask an applicant whether it would violate their covenants and restrictions. If they answered "no", then Planning did not worry about it and if they answered "yes", Planning would have to enforce it. It was a requirement by the State to ask.

Mr. Howard had a question concerning Airbnb noting it was a business in a home and wondered how enforcement worked with them. He wanted to know if they were working on anything to address them. Mr. Driggers stated they did not have a short-term rental ordinance in place. Mr. Schwerd stated that they had discussed it many times but unlike the cities and their discussion on short term rentals, Horry County had a significant amount of real estate in Garden City or Restaurant Row that were single family homes that were rented on a weekend or weekly basis. If the County had a short-term rental ordinance, it would have a significant impact on those jurisdictions. There was a significant amount of income derived from those locations in terms of vacationers coming to stay in them and a major part of Garden City was single family homes rented on short-term basis. If the County implemented a short-term rental law, they would have to create some provision to allow them to continue. Mr. Howard commented that the County was losing tax dollars. Mr. Driggers stated that some of those rentals were charging the guests taxes and paying appropriate taxes to the County and for a business license. Mr. Howard asked how they tracked the ones that did not have a business license and were just keeping the money. Mr. Driggers explained that there were different statutes they could file under and would be exempt such as a bed & breakfast and long term rentals would not be required to have a license. Mr. Howard next asked about campground rentals and wanted to know if they were subject to taxes. Mr. Driggers stated that they were and gave the example of having collected close to \$1 million from Ocean Lakes Campground and some of the other big campgrounds. Most of the campgrounds were on VRBO so taxes were being paid.

Mr. Allen asked Ms. Jones and Mr. Schwerd to have the staff put together a recommendation to bring back to the I & R Committee for discussion.

List of roads being removed from the Horry County Maintenance System: Mr. Randy Plummer presented a slide of the list of roads they had determined needed to be removed from the road maintenance system. It was determined they did not meet public benefit standards. Mr. Howard asked for confirmation that they were continuing to contact the Councilman representing the selected area. Mr. Plummer confirmed they were and Mr. Gilreath added the list was just for information purposes and would not require a vote.

Parks & Recreation Privatization Update: Ms. Stevens passed out a report and Mr. Gilreath explained it was a list of some of the changes the Committee had recommended at the last meeting. They had made the recommended changes but there were still some questions on what the requirements were so that they could be consistent. It was still a work in progress and Mr. Allen stated that he understood they were not ready to present to the committee for the public's information. Mr. McCullough explained the item that was still an issue they were working on and had to do with legal concerns with the management company. Once that had been resolved they would have a completed document to discuss.

Mr. Prince asked if any had been contracted out yet and Mr. Gilreath stated that they had not. They were still in discussions to determine if it would be feasible.

Mr. Howard asked if they had met with Mr. Chip Smith. He had heard he had some good ideas on how to go private. He suggested Mr. McCullough meet with him and get some ideas from him. Mr. Allen suggested that he could possibly be a vendor and Mr. Loftus added that he would probably even be interested in bidding on it. Mr. Allen noted that since it was such an extensive issue it would have to be worked into the upcoming budget so that Council could have a say on it. Especially on whether to go public with it or not.

Mr. McCullough referred to a previous question from Mr. Vaught concerning other counties. He had done some comparisons on current participant levels. The average, with the bigger counties, was about \$60.00 for athletics and with current participation would generate approximately \$96,000.00 in revenue.

Longs Fire Station Update: Mr. John Barnhill noted there was an updated schedule in the packet. They had completed the land purchase and were currently in the process of swapping some land with GSWSA to accommodate the building. They were expecting their proposals to the architects back that day so everything was still moving forward.

RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution to accept the road(s) and drainage in the following subdivisions into the Horry County Maintenance System: Mr. Gilreath stated that all of the following roads that had been built, designed, inspected and met County standards. He recommend that they be accepted into the County road system.

- 1) Berkshire Forest Phase 9B (*Weekly Drive, Baylor Court, Giddy Up Court, Hawkins Drive and Utsey Drive*)
- 2) Clear Pond Tract E Phase 1 (*Sandlewood Drive, White Wing Circle, Redgum Drive and Walnutwood Trail*)
- 3) Heritage Oaks Phase 2A (*Three Oak Lane*)
- 4) Palm Lakes Plantation Phase 7A (*Palm Crossing Drive, Willow Run Drive and Cypress Way*)
- 5) Palm Lakes Plantation Phase 7B (*Cypress Way and Willow Run Drive*)

Mr. Howard moved to approve. He also wanted to mention that they had discussed before taking in more and more new roads faster than the County could afford to maintain. He commented that they were

going to have to come up with some funds in probably five years or there were going to be too many roads in the system. He mentioned the \$50 road fee and asked exactly where did it come from. Mr. Gilreath stated that maintenance funds for the roads came from two sources. One was the road user fee of \$50 and was added to every taxed plate in the County and the remainder came from the General Fund. He also noted that the price of resurfacing and the cost of doing business had increased by about 30% and the Coast RTA reduction had added to the challenge. **The motion was seconded and the vote was unanimous.**

Resolution to add Frontage Road B-2 to the Local Road Plan: Mr. Larry Hamilton explained it was just a simple resolution in order to secure County funds to pave Frontage Road B-2. It would provide a paved access to the rear entrance of Grande Dunes. **Mr. Howard moved to approve.** Mr. Vaught asked to comment after the vote due to some news stories. **Mr. Howard again moved to approve and the vote was unanimous.** Mr. Vaught spoke about the news story that he had read that inferred the County was paving a private road. He wanted clarification that was not the case. Mr. Gilreath explained there were three interested parties that included Horry County (0.43 miles), the City of Myrtle Beach (0.72 miles) and Grande Dunes Golf Village (0.08 miles). He further explained the agreement that had been made as to how the cost would be shared. He also noted that Horry County would not accept any part of the completed project into the County Road Maintenance system and no County funds would be expended on portions beyond the current end of County Maintenance.

Resolution to allow Funds be transferred for Purchase of Broyhill Load and Pack in Lieu of Jetter/Vacuum Truck: Mr. Allen mentioned to the Committee that they had previously passed an ordinance amendment to their budget that any transfers of \$100,000.00 or more had to be approved by Council.

Mr. Randy Plummer explained that the resolution allowed them to transfer funds that were previously approved for the purchase of a jet/vac truck. They had recently received a FEMA grant to purchase the truck so they would like to use the funds to purchase a load and pack vehicle to help the beach services with picking up the trash more efficiently. **Mr. Howard moved to approve and the vote was unanimous.**

ORDINANCES:

An Ordinance to amend Zoning Appendix B of the Horry County Code of Ordinances pertaining to Landscape Buffer and Tree Preservation Standards: Mr. David Schwerd explained the proposed ordinance was part of their ongoing effort to simplify zoning rules, etc. It eliminated about forty pages of regulations that included duplications and confusion and would result in simplifying the standard. It had been under review for several months and the only questions were concerning the width of a berm. There were no major changes made, just simplifying the language.

Mr. Vaught stated he was all for simplification but he did have one concern with the sloping of the berms. At the suggested slope, it would take away more of the owner's property to comply with zoning regulations. It would amount to the County taking away the right for a property owner to use that particular part of his property to accommodate the slope requirement. Mr. Schwerd noted that it was a voluntary option not a required one, but if the property owner decided to build a berm, they would have to follow zoning requirements. Prior to Stormwater regulations being amended the old requirements were 2:1 ratio across the board everywhere. The current requirement in the Stormwater design manual was 3:1 ratio. Berms were a good option and were easier to maintain than a fence or a wall. Mr. Gilreath added that most berms they saw were not 3:1 but were probably 1 ½ to 2:1 range.

Mr. Prince asked if there was anything they needed to do in order to address Mr. Vaught's concerns. Mr. Schwerd noted that it was up to Council to decide what they preferred and Zoning would go with that. Mr. Gilreath suggested to the Committee that they did not want to remove the regulation and go to something that was too easy. **Mr. Howard moved to approve and the vote was unanimous.**

An Ordinance to amend Zoning Appendix B of the Horry County Code of Ordinances pertaining to General Provisions for Light and Glare Regarding Exterior Lighting: Mr. Schwerd explained there was a current lighting and glare ordinance in place. The problem was that there was no way to measure glare and most of their complaints were about glare. They had determined that the problem was simply the angle of the light. Some of the overlays had standards that differed from the other overlays and that along with the angle of the lights caused the problems. The proposed amendment to the ordinance simply stated that the lights had to be angled downwards toward the ground. **Mr. Howard moved to approve and the vote was unanimous.**

An Ordinance to amend Zoning Appendix B of the Horry County Code of Ordinances pertaining to Signage Requirements: Mr. Schwerd explained the ordinance was a comprehensive re-write of every sign regulation in Horry County. He stated that according to the Chairman of the Planning Commission, the current sign regulations were not good nor constitutional. Horry County sign regulations had been cobbled together, adopted and revised many times over the years, along with the addition of thirteen overlays that affected signage. The proposed ordinance would address those and regulate signs in time, place and manner. It was written by a committee of the sign industry as well as members of the Planning Commission together. The sign industry's input would address the standards and the Planning Commission's input would address the esthetic issues as well as location and sign issues. They had also re-written every single overlay using the same terminology and standards throughout.

Mr. Allen asked if he could review their current political signage ordinance. Mr. Schwerd stated that it had completely changed. He noted that at the State level they were currently discussing a bill to allow political signs within the public rights of way. Horry County did not allow any unless it was a governmental sign. In the current revision being proposed, they did not regulate political signs any different from a regular temporary sign and there was no time frame to put it up or take it down before or after an election. The size of the sign would depend on where it was located as in a residential neighborhood vs commercial property. **Mr. Howard moved to approve and the vote was unanimous.**

An Ordinance to amend Zoning Appendix B , Article VII, Section 703 "Commercial Forest/Agriculture Zoning Districts" of the Horry County Code of Ordinances Pertaining to Multifamily: Mr. Schwerd noted that the proposed ordinance had been drafted at the request of Council. The original discussion that County Council had about a year ago was the removal of multi-family from CFA overall. The Planning Commission deferred it and decided not to do anything about it. Last year Council had directed staff to draft an ordinance to remove wetlands from the calculations for multi-family in CFA. It had been drafted and they had just received it back from the Planning Commission who had recommended against that change. He explained it was a very simple change and summarized the formula for the recommended change noting that was what the proposed ordinance would allow. He displayed a slide showing the areas in question. He also summarized the history of the different zones that resulted in CFA zoning in 1997 and the reasoning for the revisions.

He referred to the slides noting that the majority of CFA zoned areas were in areas shown as scenic conservation and was the main reason it had never been rezoned or developed. A lot of the land had

hydric soils, adjacent flood zones as well as some wetlands. There were some CFA's in suburban areas that would support multi-family and would be appropriate to develop.

One of the main areas of concern by the Planning Commission was if they started reducing the density it would affect the value and was the main reason for the non-recommendation. Mr. Hardee noted it would also stop the conservation and scenic tax credits the property owners received. Mr. Allen asked if there were multiple CFA's added along the highway, how it would contribute to the community flooding. Mr. Schwerd explained a couple of scenarios and how they could possibly affect the area. He also noted there were several different aspects they would need to review and consider. It was not necessarily the number of units but how they were built.

Mr. Howard stated that he thought the ordinance was a little more than they could determine that day and suggested they needed to study it a little further. Mr. Hardee agreed and added they would need to look at it legally as well as the protection of the areas in question.

Mr. Allen asked Mr. Schwerd what the staff thought about it. Mr. Schwerd stated that they preferred a more comprehensive review instead of just a blanket approach. They also thought that a design-based approach would be better as well. Mr. Howard moved to send the ordinance back to Planning for further study. Mr. Schwerd commented that they were open to more study but he did not know the timing from the Planning Commission's review. Mr. Hardee asked if they could bring back staff's recommendations and Mr. Schwerd confirmed they could do that.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Mr. Hardee moved to enter executive session and the vote was unanimous. Mr. Hardee moved to exit executive session.

Mr. Carotti stated that while in executive session the Committee engaged in the discussion of negotiations incident to the sale or purchase of property and received legal advice covered by the attorney client privilege. While in Executive Session, no decisions were made and no votes were taken.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

ADJOURNMENT: Mr. Allen moved to adjourn at 10:59 a.m. and the vote was unanimous.



ISSUE:

Should the Planning & Zoning department alter the current signage used to advertise rezoning actions?

BACKGROUND:

Horry County Council has tasked the Planning Department with perusing alternatives to the traditional rezoning notification signage. Currently, all rezoning requests are advertised in a newspaper of general circulation and signs are posted on the property in accordance with state law. State law requires a sign to be posted along every portion of the property that fronts on a right of way. In addition to the newspaper publication and posting of property, notices are sent via mail to all property owners within a 500' distance of the property requesting the rezoning.

Currently, the Planning & Zoning department is limited to 25 applications per month per county ordinance. The rezoning process typically takes 90 - 120 days from submittal to third reading by County Council. With the advertising criteria set out by state law, amount of rezoning applications accepted in a single month, and the revolving window of overlapping timelines, the amount of signs required could vary drastically.

ANALYSIS:

Current Signage

Is 3 sq. ft. fluted plastic and double sided. The sign contains generic information and instructs the interested individual to contact the Planning & Zoning Department for more information. Price is currently \$13.99 each (per 100).

Option A

Is a larger rendition of the current signage measuring in at 5.3 sq. ft. In addition to the Planning and Zoning department contact, the sign could also indicate the application # and the Planning Commission meeting date associated with the request. Price has been quoted at \$44.00 each but will vary with quantity.

Option B

Is a metal, 3mm ACP panel sign. The sign measures 5.3 sq. ft. Signs would be reusable and are one sided. Price has been quoted at \$93.63 each.

Option C

Is a large, 4'x8' wood panel sign. This option could display more information than options A & B. These types of signs are printed and would not be reusable. Price has been quoted at \$405.00 each.

A BILL

TO AMEND THE CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, BY ADDING CHAPTER 61 TO TITLE 48 SO AS TO ENACT THE "SOUTH CAROLINA RESILIENCE REVOLVING FUND ACT"; TO ESTABLISH THE "SOUTH CAROLINA RESILIENCE REVOLVING FUND" TO PROVIDE LOW INTEREST LOANS TO PERFORM FLOODED-HOME BUYOUTS AND FLOODPLAIN RESTORATION, TO AUTHORIZE THE BANK TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS IN ORDER TO PROPERLY FUNCTION, TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN CRITERIA FOR LOANS AND ELIGIBLE FUND RECIPIENTS, TO PROVIDE CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MONIES WITHIN THE FUND, TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS TO EFFECTIVELY OPERATE THE FUND.

Amend Title To Conform

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina:

SECTION 1. Title 48 of the 1976 Code is amended by adding:

"CHAPTER 61
South Carolina Resilience Revolving Fund Act

Section 48-61-10. This chapter may be cited as the 'South Carolina Resilience Revolving Fund Act'.

Section 48-61-20. As used in this chapter:

- (1) 'Authority' means the Department of Administration's South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office.
- (2) 'Conservation easement' means an interest in real property as defined in Chapter 8, Title 27, the South Carolina Conservation Easement Act of 1991.
- (3) 'Department' means the Department of Administration.
- (4) 'Eligible fund recipient' means:
 - (a) the State of South Carolina and any agency, commission, or instrumentality of the State;
 - (b) local governments of the State and any agency, commission, or instrumentality of the local government; and
 - (c) land trusts operating within the State accredited by the Land Trust Accreditation Commission, an independent program of the Land Trust Alliance that provides independent verification that land trusts meet the high standards of land conservation, stewardship, and nonprofit management in the nationally recognized Land Trust Standards and Practices.
- (5) 'Floodplain restoration' means any activity undertaken to reestablish the hydrology and ecology of the floodplain to its natural state.
- (6) 'Fund' means the South Carolina Resilience Revolving Fund.
- (7) 'Loan' means a loan from the authority to an eligible fund recipient for the purpose of financing all or a portion of the cost of a project.
- (8) 'Loan agreement' means a written agreement between the authority and a project sponsor with respect to a loan.
- (9) 'Loan obligation' means a bond, note, or other evidence of obligation issued by a project sponsor to evidence its indebtedness under a loan agreement with respect to a loan.
- (10) 'Local government' means any county, city, town, municipal corporation, authority, district, commission, or political subdivision created by the General Assembly or established pursuant to the laws of this State.
- (11) 'Multi-family residence' means a building with multiple separate residential housing units.
- (12) 'Primary single family residence' means a single detached dwelling that is occupied as the main home by the owners for the majority of the year.
- (13) 'Proposed project' means a plan submitted to the authority by an eligible fund recipient for the use of loan funds.
- (14) 'Repetitive loss' means a residence that sustained two or more incidents of weather-related flooding causing damages over one thousand dollars each within a period of ten consecutive years.

Section 48-61-30. There is created the South Carolina Resilience Revolving Fund. The fund is governed by the authority. The authority is a public instrumentality of this State, and the exercise by it of a power conferred in this chapter is the performance of an essential public function. The director and staff of the South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office comprise the authority, under the supervision and review of the Director of the department and the Governor.

Section 48-61-40. (A) With regard to the fund, the authority is authorized to:

- (1) make and service below-market interest rate loans and grants as financial incentives to eligible fund recipients meeting the criteria of Section 48-61-50 for the purchase of flooded properties and land to complete floodplain restorations, so long as the loans advance the purposes of this chapter and meet applicable criteria;
- (2) enter into loan agreements and accept and enforce loan obligations, so long as the loans advance the purposes of this chapter and meet applicable criteria;
- (3) receive and collect the inflow of payments on loan amounts;
- (4) apply for and receive additional funding for the fund from federal, state, private, and other sources;
- (5) receive charitable contributions and donations to the fund;
- (6) receive contributions to the fund in satisfaction of any public or private obligation for flooding mitigation, whether such obligation arises out of law, equity, contract, regulation, administrative proceeding, or judicial proceeding. Such contributions must be used as provided for in this chapter;
- (7) make and execute contracts and all other instruments and agreements necessary or convenient for the performance of its duties and the exercise of its powers and functions;
- (8) establish policies and procedures for the making and administration of loans, fiscal controls, and accounting procedures to ensure proper accounting and reporting; and
- (9) exercise its discretion in determining what portion of funds must be disbursed and awarded in any particular year and what portion of funds shall remain in the fund from one fiscal year to the next. Sums within the fund must be invested or deposited into interest-bearing instruments or accounts, and the accrued interest must be credited to the fund.

(B) To carry out these functions, the authority shall:

- (1) operate a program in order to implement the purposes of this chapter;
- (2) receive final approval from the State Fiscal Accountability Authority for fund disbursements prior to the issuance of a loan;
- (3) develop additional guidelines and prescribe procedures, consistent with the criteria and purposes of this chapter;

- (4) submit an annual report to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, State Treasurer, and General Assembly that:
 - (a) accounts for fund receipts and disbursements;
 - (b) briefly describes applications submitted to the fund and, in greater detail, describes grants and loans that were approved or funded during the current year and the public benefits, including increased flood retention resulting from such grants and loans;
 - (c) describes recipients of fund loans and grant monies; and
 - (d) sets forth a list and description of all loans and grants approved and all acquisitions of homes and lands obtained since the fund's inception; and
- (5) have an annual audit of the fund conducted by outside independent certified public accountants and submitted to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, State Treasurer, and General Assembly. The accounting of fund receipts and expenditures required above must be part of this annual audit.

Section 48-61-50. (A) In the issuing of loans, the authority must:

- (1) prioritize the buyout of blocks or groups of homes rather than individual homes so that no more than fifteen percent of funds disbursed in a fiscal year go toward individual home buyouts;
- (2) prioritize buyouts of single-family primary residences and multi-family residences;
- (3) consider the availability of additional funding sources leveraged by a project;
- (4) prevent the use of the fund for homes built after July 1, 2020;
- (5) prevent the use of the fund for proposed projects that involve the use of eminent domain; and
- (6) prioritize the use of the fund for low and moderate income households making less than one hundred twenty-five percent of the median household income in the jurisdiction of the eligible fund recipient.

(B) The authority must issue loans using the following criteria and conditions:

- (1) offer a funding package of grants and loans for a particular project that carries an overall effective interest rate equivalent to no higher than forty percent of the market interest rate as defined by the ten-year United States Treasury Yield Curve;
- (2) make a portion of each loan available as a grant not requiring payment as a financial incentive to reduce the loan amount, that portion being no greater than twenty-five percent and no less than five percent of the total project disbursement, to incrementally reward those eligible fund recipients that execute beneficial flood mitigation practices. To qualify for a grant, eligible fund recipients must execute one or more of the following beneficial flood mitigation practices:

- (a) ensuring residents relocate outside of the floodplain;
 - (b) aiding residents in relocating outside of the floodplain and within the tax base;
 - (c) aiding residents in relocating outside of the floodplain within an area designated as an opportunity zone;
 - (d) conducting floodplain restoration after the property is converted to open space to reestablish the full water storing benefits of the floodplain;
 - (e) completing a buyout of an area larger than ten acres; and
 - (f) other activities as deemed appropriate by the authority so long as they contribute to flood resilience in the community of the buyout;
- (3) require that acquired properties are returned to open space and that all future development on the parcel is prohibited in perpetuity through easement; and
- (4) prohibit the use of more than five hundred thousand dollars for each housing unit receiving loan funds.
- (C) Eligible fund recipients may apply for loans from the fund to complete:
- (1) buyouts of repetitive loss properties;
 - (2) buyouts of repetitive loss properties with land intended for floodplain restoration; and
 - (3) floodplain restoration in connection with buyouts funded through other mechanisms.
- (D) In order to qualify for a loan, eligible fund recipients must apply to the authority and, at a minimum, meet the following criteria:
- (1) for buyouts of repetitive loss properties:
 - (a) identify specific properties included in the proposed project;
 - (b) demonstrate how the properties qualify as repetitive loss properties;
 - (c) identify a plan and timeline for returning the property to open space within six months following the completion of the buyout and holding an easement on the land in perpetuity;
 - (d) complete an economic assessment to show the costs and benefits of the project; and
 - (e) identify any beneficial flood mitigation practices planned for the project;
 - (2) for buyouts of repetitive loss properties with land intended for floodplain restoration:
 - (a) identify specific properties included in the proposed project;

- (b) demonstrate how the properties qualify as repetitive loss properties;
 - (c) identify a plan and timeline for returning the property to open space within six months following the completion of the buyout and holding an easement on the land in perpetuity;
 - (d) complete an economic assessment to show the costs and benefits of the project;
 - (e) submit a plan for conducting floodplain restoration; and
 - (f) identify any additional beneficial flood mitigation practices planned for the project;
- (3) for other floodplain restoration:
- (a) submit a plan and timeline for conducting floodplain restoration;
 - (b) identify a plan and timeline for holding an easement on the land in perpetuity;
 - (c) complete an economic assessment to show the costs and benefits of the project; and
 - (d) identify any additional beneficial flood mitigation practices planned for the project; and
- (4) any additional criteria required by external grants contributing to the fund.
- (E) Financial criteria also must be met pursuant to the standards set by the authority. The authority may require additional criteria and exercise discretion in issuing loans.

Section 48-61-60. (A) The fund must be held and administered by the authority in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and policies, rules, regulations, directives, and agreements as may be promulgated or entered into by the authority pursuant to this chapter. Earnings on balances in the fund must be credited to the fund. Amounts remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year accrue only to the credit of the fund. Amounts in the fund must be available in perpetuity for the purpose of providing financial assistance in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

(B) The authority is authorized to deposit the following into the fund:

- (1) federal capitalization grants, awards, or other federal assistance received by the department for the purposes of the fund;
- (2) funds appropriated by the General Assembly for deposit to the fund;
- (3) payments received from a recipient in repayment of a loan;
- (4) interest or other income earned on the investment of monies in the fund; and
- (5) additional monies made available from public or private sources for the purposes of which the fund has been established.

(C) Monies in the fund may only be used to:

- (1) make loans to eligible fund recipients in accordance with the provisions of this chapter;
 - (2) earn interest on fund accounts; and
 - (3) provide for the program administration and project management activities of the fund.
- (D) The authority may establish accounts and subaccounts within the fund as considered desirable to effectuate the purposes of this chapter.

Section 48-61-70. In the annual general appropriations act for Fiscal Year 2019-2020, the General Assembly shall appropriate two million dollars to establish the fund. The department will seek out additional sources of funding to sustain the fund, including federal dollars from the Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery appropriations. Additional appropriations to the fund may be requested from the General Assembly so as to expand the capabilities of the fund.

Section 48-61-80. The Department of Administration may:

- (1) promulgate regulations to effectuate the provisions of this chapter;
- (2) establish an operational structure within its authority to administer the fund;
- (3) develop priority systems that ensure consistency with the provisions of this chapter;
- (4) prepare annual plans in accordance with this chapter;
- (5) receive monies from the fund for program administration and project management activities of the fund; and
- (6) hire staff and employ agents, advisers, consultants, and other employees, including attorneys, financial advisers, engineers, and other technical advisers and public accountants and determine their duties and compensation.

Section 48-61-90. The provisions of this chapter must be liberally construed to the end that its beneficial purposes may be effectuated. No proceeding, notice, or approval is required for loan obligations by a project sponsor or instruments or the security for the loan obligation, except as provided in this chapter. If the provisions of this chapter are inconsistent with the provisions of any other law, whether general, special, or local, then the provisions of this chapter are controlling."

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.



ISSUE

The Waste Management Recycling Fund (Fund 6) was established in fiscal year 1993 to accumulate the revenues and expenditures related to solid waste collection and recycling. Operations of this fund are financed with property tax millage levied on the unincorporated areas of the County. Twenty-four (24) convenience centers are disbursed throughout the unincorporated areas of the county as shown on the map below:



Expenditures are comprised of the operation of the centers (29%), disposal fees (28%), and hauling (43%). The current trend reflects expenditures growing faster than budget projections. The table below reflects the trends over the prior two years as well as a projection of FY2020 based on current YTD trends (FY2020 to FY2019). Please note that FY2019 included \$690,789 of Hurricane Florence debris cost.

The projected shortfall for FY2020 is \$766,000. The additional expenditure would have to be funded by Fund Balance. Fund Balance was \$1,457,157 at June 30, 2019. Reimbursement from Hurricane Matthew are anticipated in FY2020 that will increase the Fund Balance sufficiently to cover this overage. Additional revenues must be considered for this Fund in the FY2021 Budget process.

RECOMMENDATION

The Infrastructure & Regulation Committee reviewed this request at its February 25 meeting and recommends County Council's approval of the attached ordinance to recognize the additional revenue and expenditure.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE FY 2020 BUDGET (ORDINANCE NUMBER 25-19, SECTION 1) SO AS TO RECOGNIZE VARIOUS REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE IN THE WASTE MANAGEMENT RECYCLING FUND

WHEREAS, the Horry County Council adopted Ordinance 25-19 entitled “AN ORDINANCE TO RAISE REVENUE, MAKE APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPT A BUDGET FOR HORRY COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2020”; and

WHEREAS, expenditures within the fund for hauling and disposal of trash within the unincorporated area of the County is projected to exceed the FY2020 Budget; and

WHEREAS, County Council now would like to amend the FY 2020 budget, adjusting revenue and expenditures in the Waste Management Recycling Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power and authority granted to the Horry County Council by the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, and the powers granted to the County by the General Assembly of the State, it is ordained and enacted that:

1. **The FY 2020 Budget is amended as follows:**
Waste Management Recycling Fund
Revenue Shall Increase by \$ 766,000
Expenditures Shall Increase by \$ 766,000
2. **Severability:** If a Section, Sub-section, or part of this Ordinance shall be deemed or found to conflict with a provision of the South Carolina law, or other pre-emptive legal principle, then that Section, Sub-section, or part of this Ordinance shall be deemed ineffective, but the remaining parts of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
3. **Effective date:** This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage of Third Reading.
