COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT: Danny Hardee Chairman; Gary Loftus; Orton Bellamy and Al Allen

MEMBERS ABSENT:

In accordance with the FOIA, notices of the meeting were provided to the press stating the time, date, and place of the meeting.

CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Hardee called the meeting to order at approximately 9:00 a.m.

INVOCATION: Councilman Loftus gave the invocation.

PUBLIC INPUT:

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA CONTENTS: Mr. Allen moved to approve with a second from Mr. Loftus. The motion was unanimously passed.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – February 11, 2020: Mr. Bellamy moved to approve the minutes for February 11, 2020 as submitted with a second from Mr. Loftus. The motion was unanimously passed.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Fireworks prohibited zone: Mr. Randy Webster stated that he was presenting an application for a Fireworks Prohibited Zone in the Sweet Water Subdivision / HOA located in Indian Wells. It was a condominium area with no real open space and the applicant wanted to protect their community. There were asking for the prohibited zone for their specific area. He presented a slide showing the exact location. If approved, they would have to get a sign provided by the County to post. No one from the public provided comments during the public hearing. **Mr. Loftus moved to approve with a second from Mr. Bellamy. The motion was passed unanimously.**

ORDINANCES:

Amending Sec. 5-22 of Chapter 5 (Beaches) Horry County Code of Ordinances, so as to provide for Standards for the Infant Cabana Exception to the Prohibition of Tents along the beaches in Unincorporated Horry County. Chief Winburn explained that County had enacted an ordinance several years ago restricting tents and large cabanas on the beaches. In the ordinance, there was an exception for small pop-ups or blow up cabanas that could be utilized for infants and small children. The problem that the Beach Patrol was having was people's interpretation of the rule. Beachgoers would put up large tents and cabanas and when approached by Beach Patrol, they stated it was for their small child or infant. They also noted they had read the ordinance and there were no dimension restrictions listed. His request was for approval to add one sentence to the ordinance. The extra sentence would specify the exact dimension requirements allowed for the tents and/or pop-ups for the kids. It would make it easier for the officers to enforce the ordinance when necessary. Mr. Allen asked if the amendment would have to be sent on to Council. Mr. Webster noted that it would. Mr. Loftus asked if three feet was high enough for a mother to get in and attend to the child. Chief Winburn explained that based on the way it was designed, after unzipping the front, the parent would be able to reach inside to the child. **Mr. Allen moved to approve with a second from Mr. Loftus. The vote was unanimously passed.**

Chief Winburn added that the previous Wednesday morning they had taken a large bite out of the drug network in the northern part of the County. He mentioned that by doing that, it would create a vacuum for somebody to come in to fill the demand. They would still have to be diligent and had assembled a team of officers to patrol that area heavily in order to monitor any activity.

RESOLUTIONS:

Authorizing the Fifteenth Circuit Solicitor's Office to accept, if awarded, the South Carolina Department of Public Safety Coronavirus Emergency Funding not to exceed \$91,325.00:

Ms. Cathy Floyd explained the resolution and the different things it would cover such as laptops and equipment to perform virtual guilty pleas. It would also replace some of their older equipment to include TV's, wireless headphones and printers so that people would not have to leave the courtroom. It was a no match grant and was all for equipment and nothing that would be reoccurring. **Mr. Loftus moved to approve with a second from Mr. Bellamy. The vote was unanimously passed.**

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Hurricane Evacuation Shelter Update: Mr. Randy Webster noted there had been discussions the previous year about the sheltering programs for hurricanes. Adjustments had to be made as to where. They could only properly and safely house people in shelters for 100 mph wind capacity. Beyond that speed, local shelters could not be used. That would limit shelters for Category 1 hurricanes only.

The adjustments had been made the previous year and would be carried forward for the current year. He then noted there was the added issue of Covid-19 for the current year. Sheltering in Horry County was handled by the Red Cross and partnering with the Horry County Schools. The Red Cross had assessed their normal standards of 20 sq. ft. per person and determined Covid 19 issues would change to 60 sq. ft. per person to accommodate social distancing. They had worked with the schools and managed to add three more schools to their list that gave them ten schools. He also wanted people to understand that sheltering in the schools was a last resort. They wanted to encourage residents to have a plan to leave, shelter in another location such as with a friend and to make sure it was in a safer location. The Red Cross would also screen anyone entering the shelter. Anyone showing symptoms would be relocated and DHEC would be brought in to manage those individuals. He reminded them that they were not able to shelter anyone safely in a Category 2 or higher storm. Those that had to be transferred out of the County would be picked up by Coast RTA and taken to the transfer point. They would be taken to a bus or motor coach and transferred out of the County to another location. He wanted people to understand they would be leaving Horry County once they boarded the bus. This would be for people who needed shelter and the storm was above a Category 1. They would be brought back once it was safe to do so.

Next year they would be working towards a new hurricane evacuation study with the Corps of Engineers from FEMA. They planned to review the County's evacuation zones again. They would more than likely be making a few changes after having gone through several storms that required evacuations.

Mr. Bellamy asked if at some point the County was looking to upgrade the facilities. Mr. Webster stated that currently there was not any plans to do so. They were trying to find some funding to go in with the school's permission, and do some structural engineering studies.

Mr. Allen asked how the transferred sheltering would be affected if the storm downgraded before reaching land. He wanted to know if they could open up the other shelters and bring the people back or would there be time to do that.

Mr. Webster explained that the sheltering activities would start well in advance of the storm reaching the area and would have to be done an additional 24 hours prior to the timing of previous years. The actual process of people going to shelters would need to be over before tropical storms winds of 40 mph reached the area, so once they were in the shelters that was it.

Mr. Allen commented that the public needed to know that the new schools were not built under County Code Enforcement or Standards because they were not subject to those standards.

Mr. Webster wanted everyone to understand the sheltering problems for the current year and the years moving forward. People would need to look at making different arrangements.

Mr. Loftus noted that there were signs showing the different evacuation zones but he did not think the people really understood them. He suggested that they needed to get the word out to the people that the different letters actually meant something and designated a certain area.

Mr. Webster explained they also faced the challenge of the Red Cross's sheltering plan. They preferred that folks not go to a school but rather to a hotel or further inland which would make the social distancing easier to manage. Since that was not an option for upwards of 2,000 people, they would have to work with the schools for sheltering. He hoped there wasn't a storm this year and he was actually a little nervous about how it would all work. He just wanted to remind everyone that it would not be as it always had been.

Mr. Gosnell mentioned that if ordered to evacuate, people really needed to heed the warnings. Mr. Webster agreed and stated the EOC would be activated and they would do the best they could to help anyone needing assistance. He added that they also had some capability for housing pets at the Animal Care Center, although it was very limited.

Mr. Allen asked what point would the County cease to send emergency operations out. Mr. Webster stated that their policy for that was at 60 mph sustained winds emergency vehicles would not be able to respond. The E-911 center would continue to take calls and as soon as feasible, assistance would be provided where needed. He added that the Emergency Management website had all the shelter information.



ISSUE

The County's Financial Policy, in section 2-70.8-Budget Policy states "Any budget transfer within the General Fund from a Department within one Division to a Department within another Division that exceeds \$100,000 and any budget transfer within the General Capital Projects Fund from one project to another project that exceeds \$100,000 must first be approved by County Council through a resolution before the transfer is completed. These resolutions are not required to first go through a Council Committee."

BACKGROUND

County Council approved the Fiscal Year 2019 Budget, which included a \$155,487 capital project for a Hazard Mitigation Grant Match for Generators to serve the ML Brown Facility as a component of the Capital Improvement Plan. The County received funding for the acquisition of generators from a State of South Carolina Budget Appropriation in Fiscal Year 2020 and will not use the budget originally funded for this purpose. The Police have identified a critical need to implement a system for License Plate Recognition to enhance response to crimes and protect the citizens of Horry County.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the attached resolution, which authorizes the \$155,487 from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Match for Generators to the License Plate Recognition System.



HCPD Calls for Service July 2020 (Council Districts)






July 2020 (12,422)

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
